**PROVISIONAL GENERAL PUBLISHED REASONS FOR RECONSIDERATION OF THE REMITTED
AND SUPPLEMENTARY APPEALS IN THE SMALL PELAGIC: ANCHOVY SECTOR
FISHING RIGHT ALLOCATION PROCESS 2021/2022**

INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

1. This document is the *Provisional General Published Reasons for the Reconsideration of the Remitted and Supplementary Appeals in the Small Pelagic Anchovy (SPA) Sector*, issued by the Minister of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (the Minister).
2. During February 2022, the Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (the Department) completed the Fishing Rights Allocation Process of 2021/2022 (FRAP 2021/22), in the Small Pelagic (Anchovy) sector. The Deputy Director General: Fisheries Management, in her capacity as the Delegated Authority, published her decisions in respect of the FRAP 2021/2022 in the “*General Published Reasons for the Decisions on the Allocation of 2021/22 Fishing Rights and Quantum in the Small Pelagic: Anchovy sector*” (GPR).
3. Applicants who were dissatisfied with the Delegated Authority’s decision were entitled to appeal against the decision(s) of the Delegated Authority, in terms of section 80 of the Marine Living Resources Act 18 of 1998 (MLRA), read with regulation 5 of the Regulations to the MLRA, via the Department’s FRAP Appeals online system. The Department received two hundred and thirty (230) in the Small Pelagic (Anchovy) sector across the different categories of applicants.
4. In or during December 2024, the then Minister of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment, erstwhile Minister Barbara Dallas Creecy, in her capacity as the Appeal Authority in terms of section 80 of the MLRA, finalised her consideration of these appeals; and she issued her “*General Published Reasons for Decisions on Appeal in the Anchovy Sector: 2021/2022*” (Appeal GPR). The erstwhile Minister recorded her decision on the allocation of rights in each Category of the Anchovy Sector in Annexure A, B and C to the Appeal GPR.
5. Thereafter, several judicial review applications were instituted out of the Western Cape Division of the High Court against the decisions of the Delegated Authority and/or that of former Minister Creecy, which led to consent orders handed down during February 2025, by the honourable Judge Mantame of the Western Cape High Court. In terms of these orders, I as Minister was directed to inter alia, reconsider 24 appeals in the small pelagic sector (11 appeals Anchovy sector) with due regard to the grounds of review raised by the applicants in the above mentioned review proceedings.
6. As part of the reconsideration of the remitted appeals, the orders expressly authorise and direct that, amongst other:
 - 6.1 The Minister to revisit any and all decisions originally made on appeal and to make such alterations and/or new decisions (including, without limitation, the revocation, cancellation or reduction of any rights and/or permits and/or quantum granted or issued pursuant to any decisions previously made on appeal) as are

necessary to give effect to the determinations and allocations following my reconsideration of the appeals read together with the grounds of review, and to do so in a manner consistent with the MLRA and the applicable Regulations and policies;

- 6.2 That the applicants/appellants will be advised if there is any information from the Department's database as contemplated in paragraph 8.4.1(d) of the General Policy, or any other information outside of their application or appeal that had been relied on by the DA, and simultaneously will be provided with such information, and any other reasons relevant to their application, within 30 (thirty) calendar days from the date of this order (the further information date);
- 6.3 Applicants/appellants will be afforded 30 (thirty) calendar days from the date of the further information date, with an opportunity to supplement their appeals to the Minister or make representations arising solely in relation to such information or reasons, including being afforded an opportunity to confirm or make written representations in relation to the correctness of information contained in the Department's database as contemplated in paragraph 8.4.1(d) of the General Policy insofar as such information was relied on by the DA;
- 6.4 The Minister to publish and email to the applicants/appellants any proposed outcome of the reconsidered decision in respect of or affecting the rights of the applicants/appellants (which shall include a proposed reduction of the percentage of the total allowable catch allocated to each of the applicants/appellants by the DA, or a proposed alteration of their score on appeal, or a proposed decision adversely affecting the applicants/appellants rights or the allocation made to it by the DA), together with the proposed reasons for the reconsidered decision, and all information and documents relevant to the proposed decision (but not yet provided to the applicants/appellants), affording them and all interested and affected parties with an opportunity to state their case in relation thereto, within 30 (thirty) calendar days thereafter;
- 6.5 Pending the final outcome of the Minister's reconsidered appeal decision by no later than Friday, 29 August 2025, the appeal decision taken on 20 December 2023 (of the DA) shall in the interim remain in force and in effect;
- 6.6 The Deputy Director General: Fisheries Management (DDG:FM) within the Department of Forestry Fisheries and the Environment is directed to issue permits to the applicants/appellants for commercial fishing rights in the Small Pelagic, Anchovy sector pursuant to the abovementioned steps on application by such applicants/appellants and subject to fulfilling the prescribed requirements for such permits to enable such applicants/appellants to utilise their aforementioned fishing rights from a date following on the above process which date shall be no later than 1 September 2025.
7. In accordance with the orders, on or about 4 April 2025, the DDG: FM addressed a letter (DDG:FM's letter) to the relevant applicants/appellants, informing them of the information obtained from the Department's internal database as contemplated in Paragraph 8.4.1(d) of the General Policy, which had been relied upon in the assessment of the applications. The letter provided the applicant/ appellants with such information

and afforded them the opportunity to supplement their appeals to the me as the appeal authority or make representations solely in relation to such information or reasons, within 30 days thereof.

8. In further compliance of the order, I have considered the remitted appeals, the supplementary appeal grounds and the grounds of review as set out in the respective review applications. Each Appellant related to the remitted appeal has been provided with a Provisional Appeal Decision. I have set out my reasons for the proposed outcome of the reconsidered appeals and several options for the proposed outcome on the allocation of rights and allocation of Total Allowable Catch (TAC) in this document. The relevant applicants/appellants, as interested and affected parties, are afforded an opportunity to provide their comments any aspect of their individual provisional appeals decision pertaining to their remitted appeal and on the various options for the adoption of the Quantum Allocation methodology (QAM) as proposed for the allocation of rights and Total Allowable Catch (TAC) in this sector.
9. The Provisional Appeals GPR for Remitted and Supplemented Appeals in the SPA Sector does not deal with specifics of each of the remitted appeals and their scoring concerns. In that regard, the applicants/appellants are referred to the individual provisional appeal decisions, which must be read in conjunction with their individual score sheets and herewith.

DELEGATED AUTHORITY'S QUANTUM ALLOCATION METHODOLOGY (QAM) AND RIGHTS ALLOCATION PROCESS

10. On the comparative balancing criteria, the Delegated Authority determined that Category A applicants with a Final Score $\geq 40\%$ would be granted a right and that applicants with a Final Score of less than 40 (i.e. $< 40\%$) would not be successful. This cut-off level was taken as indicating a poor overall performance by previous right holders and was implemented to enable the incorporation of new entrants (including those who were previously active in the Small Pelagic Sector but only fished for sardine) into the anchovy fishery. Rather than excluding poor performers by using a cut-off score of 50%, poor performers had their previous % TAC allocations reduced.
11. The top 10 scoring Category B applicants and the top 10 scoring Category C applicants (in terms of their Final Scores), were examined in detail on the following criteria:
 - 11.1 Evidence of developed or in-development methods for anchovy product beneficiation and hence value-adding to industrial fish;
 - 11.2 Demonstrated investment in fishing-related industries;
 - 11.3 Their previous job creation performance;

- 11.4 Their location, as broadening access to impoverished coastal regions, particularly on the East Coast, was considered important.
- 12 The DA allocated 100% of the TAC to successful applicants but withheld 10% of the TAC tonnage for appeals (100% of 270 000t was allocated instead of 90% of 300 000t). The DA applied the following QAM:
- 12.1. The starting point was to consider each successful Category A right holder's % of anchovy TAC held during the previous rights process;
- 12.2. Successful Category A right holders whose previous %TAC would result in them being allocated <1500 t (the minimum quantum) of the final TAC had their % TAC increased;
- 12.3. Each applicant was then allocated TAC such that no entity received less than 1500 t;
- 12.4. The % TAC previously held by unsuccessful/excluded Category A applicants was made available for new entrants;
- 12.5. The 2 largest successful Category A right holders (in terms of their previous allocations) had their % TAC reduced by 10%;
- 12.6. The next 3 largest successful Category A right holders had their %TAC reduced by 8 %; these reductions to the TAC previously held by the 5 largest entities were necessary to make a larger proportion of the TAC available for new entrants, including those Category A applicants that previously only held rights to sardine, and successful Category A applicants that previously had TACs less than 1500t;
- 12.7. This reduction in allocation as well as the allocation from Category A applicants that were unsuccessful resulted in 16% of the TAC being available for reallocation to new entrants.
- 12.8. This TAC was redistributed to the new entrants in the Anchovy Sector as per the delegated authority's decision. Of these, 18 entities were Category A applicants who previously held rights in the Sardine fishery only.
- 12.9. Successful Category A applicants were divided into 10 percentile (%-ile) groups according to the size of their previous allocations and their performance was evaluated relative to the average of that group. Applicants that performed higher than average had their initial allocation increased slightly whereas applicants that performed below average had their allocations reduced slightly.
- 13 In terms of the DA's decision:
- 13.1. Ten percent (10%) of the TAC tonnage was reserved for appeals;
- 13.2 59 of the 78 Category A Applicants were successful sharing 93.550 % of the TAC,
- 13.3 3 of the 94 Category B Applicants were successful sharing 2.97 % of the TAC, and

13.4 6 of the 174 Category C applicants were granted rights in this sector with a combined TAC of 3,66 %.

OUTCOME OF THE APPEALS UNDER THE FORMER MINISTER

14 In considering the 230 appeals submitted against the decisions taken by the Delegated Authority in this sector, the former Minister determined the following outcome on appeal:

14.1. 11 additional Category A appellants qualified on appeal to be awarded a right, having scored higher than the threshold. The Minister also undertook a re-evaluation of the relative performance of all successful applicants/appellants. This resulted in some previous above-average performers becoming below-average performers and vice-versa and these adjustments were incorporated into her appeal decisions.

14.2 1 additional Category B appellant qualified to be awarded a right on appeal.

14.3 No additional Category C applicants qualified to be awarded a right on appeal

15 Regarding the allocation of TAC, the former Minister followed a similar approach on appeal to that of DA, but gave consideration to the following:

15.1 The minimum TAC of 1500t, as determined by the DA, was confirmed and adopted in the appeal process;

15.2 Considering that the DA had allocated 100% of the TAC to all successful applicants, notwithstanding the Sector Specific Policy requirement that 10% thereof be held in reserve for appeals, the former Minister reduced the allocation of TAC to all successful applicants per the DA's GPR by 10%. Through this rectification, the former Minister recouped the 10% of TAC that should have been kept in reserve for her to distribute on appeal.

15.3 However, due to the large number of successful appellants and the former Minister's decision to increase the number of Category B and C entrants into the sector, the percentage of TAC allocated to the successful applicants had to be further reduced to accommodate these additional entrants on appeal while ensuring that no entity was allocated below the minimum TAC of 1 500t.

15.4 In this regard, the TAC that had been allocated to the two (2) largest companies was reduced by 19% while the TAC of the next three largest companies was reduced by 17.2%, and the TAC allocated to the remaining was also reduced, while ensuring that no entity's TAC was reduced to below 1 500t.

PROPOSED OUTCOMES ON THE ALLOCATION OF RIGHTS AND QUANTAM FOLLOWING THE RECONSIDERATION OF THE REMITTED APPEALS

16. The court orders having set aside the DA's QAM, specifically insofar as it did not follow adequate process specifically per the section 80(3) MLRA, have necessitate that I consider a QAM that would be fair and

reasonable considering all relevant factors. This includes notifying affected parties of any revocation of rights and/or any proposed reduction in the percentage of the TAC to each applicant or appellant by the DA, or any other proposed decision that may adversely affect their rights or the allocation previously made by the DA.

17. Having reconsidered the remitted appeals, I now set out my proposed outcome regarding allocation of rights and TAC. I propose hereinbelow various options on the allocation of rights and TAC, thereby affording the affected parties an opportunity to state their case in relation thereto, within 30 (thirty) calendar days from the date of publication of this Provisional Appeals GPR for Remitted and Supplemented Appeals in the SPA Sector.
18. Each of the options provided is guided by the following considerations:
 - 18.1. The number of successful applicants in each category;
 - 18.2. The need for stability in the sector;
 - 18.3. The need to admit new entrants in a sector that is already highly transformed;
 - 18.4. The level of access to fishing vessels, investment in the sector and job creation amongst others;
 - 18.5. The anticipated anchovy TAC over the short to medium term;
 - 18.6. The determination of a minimum meaningful allocation; and
 - 18.7. The changed status of the anchovy resource since 2022.
19. The above factors are guided by:
 - 19.1. The General Policy on the Allocation of Commercial Fishing Rights: 2021 (the General Policy) and the Sector Specific Policy on the Allocation of Commercial Fishing Rights in the Anchovy Sector: 2021 (the Sector Specific Policy), both of which informed and guided the FRAP 2021/2022.
 - 19.2. The objectives and principles of the MLRA: (a) the need to achieve optimum utilisation and ecologically sustainable development of marine living resources; (b) the need to conserve marine living resources for both present and future generations; (c) the need to apply precautionary approaches in respect of the management and development of marine living resources; (d) the need to utilise marine living resources to achieve economic growth, human resource development, capacity building within fisheries and mariculture branches, employment creation and a sound ecological balance consistent with the development objectives of the national government; (e) the need to protect the ecosystem as a whole, including species which are not targeted for exploitation; (f) the need to preserve marine biodiversity; (g) the need to minimise marine pollution; (h) the need to achieve to the extent practicable a broad and accountable participation in the decision-making processes provided for in this Act; (i) any relevant obligation of the national government or

the Republic in terms of any international agreement or applicable rule of international law; and (j) the need to restructure the fishing industry to address historical imbalances and to achieve equity within all branches of the fishing industry.

20. Each appellant whose appeal has been remitted to me for reconsideration, has received a provisional appeal decision and is afforded an opportunity to state their case in relation thereto, within 30 (thirty) calendar days from the date of receipt thereof.
21. Having evaluated multiple alternative scenarios in consultation with the Technical Advisory Team, it is now well established that the number of anchovy right holders must be reduced to enhance industry stability and to reflect the changed status of this resource. This can be achieved in several ways, including (i) raising the threshold for Category A applicants above the previously used 40%; (ii) limiting the number of new entrants; or (iii) applying a combination of these measures.
22. The following five options, recommended by the Technical Advisory Team, outline the alternative approaches that I deem appropriate to achieve this objective:
23. **Option 1:**
 - 23.1. This option retains the 40% threshold for successful Category A applicants but decreases the number of Category B new entrants to two and the Category C new entrants to two. Instead of 10 new entrants as allocated by the Minister on appeal, the number of new entrants is reduced to four.
 - 23.2. It allows for upfront % reductions in the size of allocations of the largest 5 companies that are substantially smaller than that applied by the Minister in finalising the appeals but still higher than originally used by the DA (-13% for the 3 companies holding the most TAC and -.11% for the next three companies in terms of their previously held TAC).
 - 23.3. It allows for a small increase in the size of rights of Category A right holders that performed above-average (+2%) and retains a large, albeit reduced, decrease in the size of the penalty of poor performers (from -37% on appeal to -34%).
 - 23.4. This option demonstrates the trade-off required between the number of new entrants on the one hand and the % upfront reduction in the allocations of the largest 5 companies.
 - 23.5. Six new entrant rights are revoked and the percentage of the TAC allocated to new entrants is reduced from 6.63% to 3.31%.

24. **Option 2:**

- 24.1. This option increases the threshold for successful Category A applicants from 40 to 45%, and as for Option 1 above, limits the number of new entrants to four.
- 24.2. It allows for upfront % reductions in the size of allocations of the largest 5 companies that are the same as originally used by the DA (-10% for the 3 companies holding the most TAC and -8% for the next three companies in terms of their previously held TAC).
- 24.3. It allows for a small increase in the size of rights of Category A right holders that performed above-average (+3.2%) and a moderate decrease in the size of the penalty of poor performers (from -37% on appeal to -25%, less than that originally applied by the DA).
- 24.4. This option limits the number of Category A applicants that lose their rights to four. It demonstrates the trade-off required between the threshold and number of new entrants on the one hand and the penalty to poor performing Category A right holders.
- 24.5. Six new entrant rights are revoked and the percentage of the TAC allocated to new entrants is reduced from 6.63% to 3.31%. Four (4) Category A rights are revoked (including that of three previous sardine-only right holders).

25. **Option 3**

- 25.1. This option increases the threshold for successful Category A applicants from 40 to 48%.
- 25.2. As a result, three (3) additional category A right holder's rights are revoked resulting in a total of 7 Category A rights being revoked.
- 25.3. The percentages by which the largest companies are reduced is decreased to below that which was implemented by the DA (from -10% to -7% for the largest 3 companies and from -8% to -5% for the next three largest companies in terms of their previously held % right).
- 25.4. There is a reasonable bonus (+5%) for previous Category A above-average performers and only a moderate penalty (-14.70% rather than the previously applied -37%) for Category A below-average performers.
- 25.5. As for Option 1 and 2 above, six (6) new entrant's rights are revoked but the percentage of the TAC allocated to new entrants is further reduced from 3.31% to 2.5%.

26. **Option 4:**

- 26.1. As for option 3, this option increases the threshold for successful Category A applicants from 40 to 48%.

- 26.2. As a result, seven (7) category A right holder's rights are revoked.
- 26.3. This option differs from Option 3 in respect of the methodology used to allocate rights to the largest five companies.
- 26.4. Instead of an upfront reduction in the size of their rights, the largest 5 companies are individually evaluated in terms of their performance relative to the average performance of these 5 companies, consistent with the approach for other Category A right holders.
- 26.5. As a result, 3 of the largest 5 companies, who performed above-average receive their original allocations while the other two are penalised by -12.4 %, consistent with other poor performing Category A right holders. Consequently, the % allocation of two of the largest 5 companies are reduced to a greater extent than in Option 3 above.
- 26.6. Given no decreases in the rights of the remaining 3 largest companies, there is no scope for bonuses for above-average Category A performers as the size of the penalty is constrained to be of a similar magnitude to that of Option 3 above.
- 26.7. As for Option 3 above, the total allocation to new entrants is reduced from 3.31 to 2.5 %.

27. **Option 5:**

- 27.1. This option increases the threshold for Category A applicants from 40% to 50%. The consequence of this higher threshold is that twelve (12) Category A applicants, including 4 previous sardine-only right holders, become unsuccessful. The largest of these 12 right holders previously held 4.25% of the anchovy rights and jointly these 12 right holders previously held 13.7 % of the anchovy TAC. Hence their removal makes a considerable amount of TAC available for redistribution.
- 27.2. This option demonstrates the trade-off between a higher threshold and the penalty for poor performers, while retaining the method for evaluating the largest 5 companies as in Option 4 above.
- 27.3. This option allows for a generous increase for above-average performers (+10%) and a smaller (-6.8%) penalty for poor performers, including for the two below-average largest 5 companies (compared to Option 4 above).
- 27.4. This is the only option that allows for an increase for three (3) of the five largest above-average performing companies.
- 27.5. This option has the same number of new entrants as in Options 1-4 and the same total allocation to Category B and C new entrants as in Options 3-4.
- 27.6. This option does, however, still result in the revocation of 8 previous anchovy right holder's rights as well as that of four (4) previous sardine-only right holders.

* The applicant has disclosed that it is in a brother-sister relationship with a successful Category A applicant, namely Balobi Processor (Pty) Ltd. In this regard, section 8.6.1 of the General Policy on the Allocation and Management of Commercial Fishing Rights: 2021 provides that: "A company and its subsidiary/ies may not be granted more than one right in the sector applied for, to avoid fronts and monopolies and to broaden access to the marine resources." Further, section 8.6.2 of the General Policy stipulates that: "If two or more companies which are owned and controlled by the same shareholders apply for a commercial fishing right in any fishing sector, the Delegated Authority will consider allocating a fishing right to one of the companies if two or more of the brother-sister companies qualify for a fishing right in that particular sector. The Delegated Authority may also consider dividing one fishing right between the brother-sister companies if they all qualify for a fishing right in the fishing sector applied for." In making my final determination on the allocation of rights, due consideration will be given to the implications of this relationship in terms of the applicable policy provisions.
