## REQUIREMENTS FOR A RECREATIONAL IMPORT PERMIT

- Original, completed, signed and dated application form.
- A true certified copy of identity document.

## **PLEASE NOTE:**

- Copies of supporting documents must be certified as true copies and must not be dated older than 3 months. Failure to provide true certified copies of documents will result in the permit application being delayed or not processed or not issued.
- No faxes, copies, and e-mails will be accept

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

- The application process may take 7 working days or more subject to proper lodging of the application.
- No permit is required for bait. However, please ensure that you have in your possession either
  a recreational bait permit (only the daily bag limit can be transported) or a cash slip for bait
  purchased.
- Applications received via post:- On receipt of the application form, the Customer Service Centre
  will contact the applicant with a deposit reference number for payment. A cheque for the full
  amount can also accompany the application. (Cheque/s must be made payable to the Marine
  Living Resources Fund (MLRF).

The bank deposit slip (proof of payment) reflecting payment of **R505.00** per applicant must be faxed to 021-402 3362 before the permits/s can be processed.
