



FACT SHEET: ONE YEAR OF PROGRESS UNDER MINISTER DION GEORGE

Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (DFFE)

STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

1. Protecting Biodiversity & Conservation

- African Penguin Victory: Court settlement secured island closures to protect critical breeding colonies; new permit conditions implemented in the small pelagic fishery.
- <u>Bunkering Regulations</u>: New laws underway to restrict ship-to-ship fuel transfers near ecologically sensitive areas such as St Croix Island.
- Rhino & wildlife protection: Strengthened anti-poaching enforcement; successful prosecutions; trade of rhino horn and lion bone under consideration.
- High Seas Treaty: South Africa signed the Biodiversity Beyond National Jurisdiction (BBNJ) Agreement – the first global treaty to protect marine biodiversity in international waters.

2. Climate Action & Just Transition

- <u>Climate Change Act implementation</u>: Strengthened legal basis for national climate response.
- <u>Coastal Adaptation Plan (CARP)</u>: Targeted strategy to reduce climate risk in vulnerable coastal communities.
- Global climate leadership: South Africa led negotiations at <u>COP29</u> and the <u>G20</u>
 Working Group, unlocking investment and reinforcing local green transitions.

3. Regulatory Reform for Growth

- RESET (Regulatory Efficiency Strategy for Environmental Turbocharge):
 - 11 Renewable Energy Development Zones fast-tracked for approvals reducing application time from 300 days to 147 days.
 - Simplified process for low-sensitivity sites approvals in under 70 days.
 - Launched <u>the National Web-Based Environmental Screening Tool</u> to speed up assessments while maintaining protections.

4. Strengthening Governance & Accountability

- o Cleared 162 appeals since July 2024 improving transparency and fairness.
- Rooted out inefficiencies and addressed disciplinary backlogs.
- Revitalisation of key entities like SAWS and SAFCOL to restore integrity and performance.

5. Economic Growth Through Sustainable Resource Use

- Agriculture, forestry and fisheries sector:
 - Q4 2024 growth: +17.2%, contributing 0.4 points to national GDP.
 - Q1 2025 growth: +15.8%, again contributing 0.4 points.
- <u>Small-scale fisheries:</u> 36% increase in fish species allocation, boosting incomes in coastal communities.
- Harbour revitalisation: 2,300+ work opportunities created in upgrade projects for small harbours.

6. International Environmental Leadership

- G20 Presidency: South Africa hosting environment-focused G20 engagements, using sites like Kruger National Park and Kirstenbosch to showcase biodiversity.
- High Seas Treaty: Played a major role in negotiating the Biodiversity Beyond National
 Jurisdiction Agreement known as the High Seas Treaty the first legally binding
 instrument to protect biodiversity in areas beyond national borders.
- SA Agulhas II: Pioneering research in the Southern Ocean uncovered microplastic pollution patterns, placing SA at the centre of global marine science.

SPECIAL PROJECTS

1. KISS: Kruger-Kirstenbosch-iSimangaliso Icon Status Strategy

- Reforming apex parks and gardens into world-class conservation, tourism, and education centres.
- o Highlights include:
 - Kirstenbosch named among the Top 10 Botanical Gardens in the world.
 - Launch of the <u>Children's Edutainment Centre</u> in Pretoria.
 - Launch of the Kgodumodumo Dinosaur Interpretive Centre at Golden Gate Highlands National Park.

2. Carbon Credits and the Green Economy

- Rolling out a national carbon credit framework to unlock green finance and incentivise low-carbon development.
- Enabling biodiversity offsets and compliance markets to stimulate private sector investment.

3. "Money" Project: Addressing Budget Shortfalls

- Comprehensive spending review across DFFE branches and entities.
- o Cost-containment measures in place.
- Minister personally engaging international donors to secure funding for anti-poaching, ranger support, enforcement, and green innovation projects.

LOOKING AHEAD

- Deepening marine protection and ratifying the High Seas Treaty.
- Accelerating the carbon credit market framework.
- Advancing anti-poaching strategies using drone tech and cross-border enforcement.
- Restructuring the DFFE to improve service delivery and public accountability.
- Hosting key G20 engagements to spotlight SA's environmental leadership.
