

Rhino Poached in South Africa

- +1300 rhinos poached from 2000
- The average number rhinoceros poached per year for the períod (1980 2004) was 6 animals p/a
- Financial loss R 650 million.
- Loss in asset value due to poaching R 1.4 billion.
- 2012 has already lost XXX rhino



Why poach rhino?

- What is the value loss to 5.A1300 $\times 5 \text{kg} = 6500 \text{ kg} \oplus $60,000??}$ = \$390 million

- · Role of Organised crime






How to win the war?

PROA Focus Areas

- Lobby/support Government in all areas of need.
- · Co-ordinate Pvt owners needs.
- Establish better population data base.
- Ensure correct use of donor funding.
- Legalise trade in rhino horn via cities.
- Support LeadSA and other media groups.
- Better co-operation with other NGOs.





State:

- · Current policy and strategy is failing
- CTES trade ban has created illegal market (1992 proposal to lift moratorium)
- Cannot wait to 2016
- National and provincial parks-financial difficulties
 -increased security cost and loss of revenue





Domestic Solution

- HAWKS are under-resourced
- Government aid and support to private owners (currently 100% to state reserves)
- Firearms
- Review TOPS legislation, electronic permitting
- Lift current domestic moratorium on trade (basis of template for international trade)
- Must be DNA/Rhodis certified





Domestic Solution

- Horn must be TOPS registered
- Owner must hold TOPS permit
- · Micro chipped
- · May only be traded in SA

Above remove "blood horns" from the market





International Solution

- · Recognize sustainable utilization
- · Strong political, international condemnation
- Collapse illegal trade by allowing legal trade
- Application to CoP16, 2013, to legalize trade (talked for 20 years)
- Use domestic template as basis for int. trade
- Commodity price, willing buyer, willing seller
- Pvt sector willing to assist
- Economic benefits of revenue back to rhino conservation





No more Big 5?? An African Crisis:

- 1895 white rhino at point of extinction, now again under threat.
- · Part of our national heritage to protect!
- · A member of the BIGFIVE
- A tourist asset.
- · Urgent need for political intervention!
