









Overall WEII score








Wildlife Status Sub-index








Wildlife asset category








Wildlife management category








Investment Enabling Environment Sub-index








Ease of doing business category








Investment safety category








Public sector capacity category







WEII is a measure of investment potential in Africa's wildlife economy. The big five investment opportunities are ecotourism, carbon market (including natural climate solutions), hunting (including some aspects of fishing), wildlife ranching, and forest products. Taken together, they constitute a market share of over USD 250 billion a year in Africa (See Snyman et al. 2021. Roadmap for Africa's Wildlife Economy).

Overview

South Africa is located in Southern Africa and a member of the Southern African Development Community(SADC) Economic Region. When assessing its wildlife economy, South Africa has a Ŵildlife Economy Investment Index Score of 63.12 ranking 1st out of 53 African countries, and 1st out of 16 in the SADC Economic region.

In terms of its wildlife status, South Africa has a wildlife status sub-index score of 55.11, ranking 1st out of 54 African countries and an investment enabling environment sub-index score of 71.13, ranking 6th out of 53 African countries.






Category Ranks & Scores


