WORKSHOP OVERVIEW:

George Orwell in his book *Animal Farm* makes the statement “All animals are equal, but some animals are more equal than others.” With a statement like this in mind, together with all of the pressures facing South Africa’s biodiversity, the Inspectorate is at the cross roads of deciding how the deployment of limited compliance and enforcement resources will result in any form of conservation success stories. This workshop will discuss these differing priorities and decide on compliance and enforcement initiatives that will address these concerns.
