Response to your query below.

- 1. Eskom has submitted all outstanding information in terms of its MES applications to DEFF by 31 August 2020 as required by the Minister of DEFF. This includes the additional technical information in respect of the previous Highveld MES applications, MES applications for Grootvlei, Acacia and Port Rex, Medupi and Matimba.
- 2. In the Medupi and Matimba applications (which are on the consultant's website, so this is officially public knowledge) we write "A strict interpretation of the amendment of the MES regulations in 2018 has potentially restricted the legal mechanisms which would provide the authorities with the ability to grant the required time for the investigation of less costly SO2 reduction technologies and Eskom's financial recovery. This application should thus also be considered as a request for exemption from compliance to the present MES timeframes to the Minister of DEFF, as allowed for in terms of section 59 of NEMAQA, if so required."
- 3. We are in the process of submitting MES exemption applications in terms of section 59 of the Air Quality act to the Minister of DEFF in respect of Medupi, Matimba and our Highveld stations. Details of these will be shared with stakeholders in due course.
