# CONSULTATION ON THE PROPOSED EXEMPTION TO BE ISSUED TO PREVIOUS ABALONE RIGHT HOLDERS FOR THE 2022/2023 ABALONE FISHING SEASON

The Deputy-Director General: Branch Fisheries Management of the Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment, Ms Sue Middleton, published the Draft "Exemption in terms of section 81 of the Marine Living Resources Act, 1998 (Act No. 18 of 1998) (MLRA) from the provisions of section 18 of the MLRA for the 2022/2023 abalone fishing season" dated 26 August 2022 on the Departmental website; <u>https://www.dffe.gov.za/legislation/publicnotices/frap</u> for public comment.

The primary purpose of the draft exemption is to enable those who held abalone rights prior to the Fishing Rights Allocation Process (FRAP) 2015/16, and whom have been granted annual exemptions since, to continue fishing subject to an exemption, pending a decision to be taken by the Department in terms of rights allocation in the commercial abalone fishing sector. A decision on future rights allocation can only be taken after scientific information has been received and public consultations have been held on the proposed way forward.

Members of the public are invited to submit comments on the draft exemption to the Deputy-Director General: Branch Fisheries Management within 30 (thirty) calendar days of the publication of this advert in the newspaper. Comments received after the closing date may not be considered.

PROPOSED EXEMPTION IN TERMS OF SECTION 81 OF THE MARINE LIVING RESOURCES ACT, 1998 (ACT NO. 18 OF 1998) (THE MLRA) FROM THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 18 OF THE MLRA FOR THE 2022/2023 ABALONE FISHING SEASON

## 1. BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

- 1.1 In terms of section 81(1) of the MLRA, "No person shall undertake commercial fishing or small-scale fishing, engage in mariculture or operate a fish processing establishment unless a right to undertake or engage in such an activity or to operate such an establishment has been granted to such a person by the Minister."
- 1.2 The 10-year abalone commercial fishing rights that were allocated to 304 applicants (264 divers plus 40 legal entities) during the 2004 Long-Term Rights Allocation Management Process (LTRAMP 2004) expired on 30 July 2014 and reverted to the state for re-allocation in terms of the provisions of section 18(6) of the MLRA. However, one (1) of the three hundred and four (304) commercial abalone rights was returned by the right holder and five (5) were revoked prior to their expiry.

- 1.3 The Department embarked on the 2015/2016 abalone Fishing Rights Allocation Process (FRAP 2015/16) and has not yet decided on the applications for allocation of abalone fishing rights which were submitted by the applicants during the FRAP 2015/16.
- 1.4 In terms of section 81(1) of the MLRA, "If in the opinion of the Minister there are sound reasons for doing so, he or she may, subject to the conditions that he or she may determine, in writing exempt any person or group of persons or organ of state from a provision of this Act." In terms of section 81(2) "an exemption granted in terms of subsection (1) may at any time be cancelled or amended by the Minister." The power to grant exemptions in terms of section 81 of the MLRA has been delegated to the Deputy Director General: Fisheries Management in terms of section 79(1)(a) of the MLRA.
- 1.5 The abalone commercial fishery has since the 2014/2015 abalone fishing season been managed on exemption from the provision of section 18 of the MLRA, which exemption has been, granted on a yearly basis in favour of the two hundred and ninety-eight (298) previous abalone Right Holders in terms of section 81(1) of the MLRA.

#### 2. INTENDED DECISION

- 2.1 In reaching my proposed decision I have considered amongst others, the following:
- 2.1.1 the MLRA, and the Regulations promulgated thereunder, the pending outcomes of the abalone FRAP 2015/16;
- 2.1.2 the economic and social impacts that may arise if the previous abalone exemption holders (i.e., previous right holders) are denied access to the abalone resource in the interim; and
- 2.1.3 the need for additional time to consider options and appropriate measures for the future sustainable management of the abalone resource.
- 2.2 For the aforementioned reasons and acting in terms of section 81 of the MLRA, I hereby intend to grant the previous 2021/2022 Abalone exemption holders (being those who held rights in the commercial

abalone fishing sector prior to FRAP 2015/16) with an exemption from the provisions of section 18 of the MLRA for the 2022/2023 abalone fishing season.

- 2.3 This exemption is granted subject to the following conditions:
- 2.3.1 The exemption holder is required to obtain a permit in terms of section 13 of the MLRA prior to commencing fishing;
- 2.3.2 a certified copy of this exemption must be kept by the Exemption Holder when fishing and be made available for inspection at any time;
- 2.3.3 in the case of an Exemption Holder which is a juristic person the Department must be informed within 30 days of the death of a shareholder or member of the Exemption Holder as the case may be;
- 2.3.4 in the event of the death of an Exemption Holder who is a natural person, the executor of the deceased estate shall notify the Department within 30 days of the death of the Exemption Holder;
- 2.3.5 at any time during the validity of the Exemption:
- 2.3.5.1 upon the death of an Exemption Holder who is a natural person, a family member of the Exemption Holder may apply for an exemption to be issued to him or her, so that he or she may continue to harvest the Exemption Holder's allocation, for the remainder of the validity period of this exemption, provided that the family member is able to show dependence on the Exemption Holder's allocation; and
- 2.3.5.2 where the Exemption Holder is a company or close corporation, the shareholding or member's interest held by a shareholder or member who passes away, may be transferred or sold with the written permission of the Department;
- 2.3.6 In taking a decision in terms of paragraph 2.3.5, the requirements and conditions of the Commercial Fishing Rights Transfer Policy must be considered.

### 3. VALIDITY PERIOD

This exemption is valid for the 2022/ 2023 abalone fishing season.

### 4. APPEAL

3.1 Kindly note that in terms of the provisions of section 80 of the MLRA and Regulation 5 of the General Regulations promulgated thereunder (GNR 111 of 2 September 1998), you may within 30 days of receipt of the final exemption, if issued, appeal to the Minister against the decision of the delegated authority. The subject and grounds for the appeal must be clearly indicated and such appeal must be submitted to the Department as follows:
