In a quest to protect South African citizens from the novel coronavirus, the lockdown resulted in a shock in the labour market and a big change in the way people went about doing their work. Due to Covid-19 lockdown and economic impacts, the sector has lost over 51 000 jobs between 2020 and 2021, of which most jobs lost where accounted to the formal sector losing over 55 000 jobs, while the informal lost just under 4000 jobs.

The DFFE has already started working with various producers to implement the Extended Producer Responsibility schemes (EPR) in 2022. The DFFE is expecting to have more jobs created and reported towards the end of the current financial year as part of the requirement from the EPR Regulations. The producers and producer responsibility organisations (PROs) are all compelled to report on the number of jobs created per annum from their EPR schemes.
