What are the reasons that the Waste Management Bureau is issuing tenders for new properties where current owners are not more than 51% compliant as opposed to setting out a roadmap for them to become black empowered? NW2242E

2088. THE MINISTER OF ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS REPLIES:

The Waste Bureau has to issue new tenders for storage and preprocessing facilities because most of the contracts with current owners are expiring on 30 September 2018 and cannot be extended further due to the fact that National Treasury only permitted the contracts to be for a maximum period of 12 months, which 12-month period now expires on 30 September 2018.
