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THE MARINE LIVING RESOURCES FUND, A SCHEDULE 3A PUBLIC ENTITY ESTABLISHED IN TERMS OF THE PUBLIC FINANCE MANAGEMENT ACT, 1999 (ACT NO 1 of 1999) AND THE DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY, FISHERIES AND ENVIRONMENT ("DFFE") (IN ITS COMMITMENT TO THE PRINCIPLES ENSHRINED IN THE CONSTITUTION OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA, 1996) ADHERES TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE BROAD BASED BLACK ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT ACT, 53 OF 2003 (B-BBEE), THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT POLICY FRAMEWORK ACT, 5 OF 2000 ("PPPF") AND THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT REGULATIONS, 2022.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

TO APPOINT A SERVICE PROVIDER (SP) TO FACILITATE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF LOCAL CO-MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE FOR SMALL-SCALE FISHING CO-OPERATIVES WITHIN THE CAPE METRO, CITY OF CAPE MUNICIPALITY, WESTERN CAPE, WITHIN SIX (6) MONTHS.

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1. PURPOSE

1.1. The Marine Living Resource Fund (MLRF), Fisheries Management Branch of the Department of Forestry, Fisheries, and the Environment requires the services of a Service Provider (SP) to facilitate the establishment local co-management structure for 23 small-scale fishing co-operatives within the Cape Metro, City of Cape Municipality, within six (6) months.

2. SPECIFICATIONS

2.1 The role of the SP will be to assist the Department in the establishment of local co-management structure within the Cape Metro, City of Cape Municipality. This will include nominations of representatives to serve in the co-management structures from the respective small-scale fishing co-operatives within the Cape Metro as indicated in the table below. In addition, the SP will also be required to conduct training and capacity building; develop co-management agreements and implement such co-management agreements for the nominated representatives (three (3) per co-operative).

- 2.2 For the MLRF to be able to provide developmental support to the co-management structures, the SP is required to conduct co-management-related training to members of the co-management structures.
- 2.3 The SP must ensure that all meetings and other activities related to the process are recorded and reported on in a format as required by MLRF and submitted as agreed to MLRF.
- 2.4 The SP must provide logistics such as booking of venues, catering (Tea/coffee with morning snacks, warm lunch with cool drink) and transport (where required) and accommodation (where required) for all participants per meeting session. The SP must also conduct monitoring and evaluation of the implementation process and to implement any revision or revisiting where required, throughout the implementation period.
- 2.5 The Service Provider must provide a close out report with relevant recommendations based on the detailed job description. The report to be submitted to the project manager within a month after the end of the project to be reviewed and approved by the project manager.
- 2.6 The SP(s) must not have financial and non-financial interest in the small-scale fisheries sector and its value chain (direct buying, processing and/or marketing of fish products from any or all small-scale fishing cooperatives in South Africa) and submit a declaration in this regard. Failure to provide such declaration will disqualify a bidder.

3. EXPECTED DELIVERABLES/OUTCOMES

- 3.1 The SP(s) will focus on the following key deliverables, which will serve as the Terms of Reference (TOR):
 - 3.1.1 Facilitating initial engagements to establish local a co-management structure.

- a) Based on the contact details you will receive from the Department and the announcement of the project; you will be required to contact all 23 small-scale fishing co-operatives informing them of your scope of work.
- b) For costing purposes service providers should refer to the "Number of members within a cooperative" column in Table1 above.

3.1.2 Establishment of small-scale fishing Local co-management structure within the Cape Metro, City of Cape Municipality.

- a) The Service Provider(s) (SP) must submit a project implementation plan and must be approved by project manager prior to the actual work start. The project plan must include a problem recognition and preliminary assessment of the project.
- c) Develop a management structure plan and clear timeframes and deliverables and schedules for meetings on the progress of the project. Which will include the project implementation plan, proposed stakeholder engagements and the formulation of a proposed co-management structure.
- d) Establish a communications and coordination approach for the duration of the project implementation period.
- e) Analysis and plan on the approach to be followed (including identification of stakeholders and possible co-management structure model).
- f) Co-operative mobilisation and Development of community facilitation schedule.

3.1.3 Finalise nominations of representation and revisit certain areas for re-election

- a) Service provider to visit all 23 small-scale fishing co-operatives to facilitate for the nomination of small-scale fishing co-operatives members who will serve and represent his/her co-operative in the local co-management structure within the Cape Metro, City of Cape Municipality, Western Cape.
- b) The service provider, with the project manager, must identify and engage with relevant stakeholders and spheres of government that would form part of or consult on the co-management structure.
- c) The Service Provider must guarantee the presence of suitable personnel to oversee fieldwork throughout the duration of the contract and provide such staff with the relevant training.
- d) The Service provider is expected to facilitate small-scale fisheries co-management structure workshops with identified stakeholders as the above. This will require the service provider to:
 - i. Book an appropriate venue.
 - ii. Provide transport and/or accommodation for participants (where required).

- iii. Provide catering including Tea (with morning snacks) and warm Lunch (with cool drink)
- iv. Facilitate the content required to establish co-management structure. By including, but not limited to:
 - Why a local co-management.
 - Roadmap to establishing a local co-management structure.
 - Develop and implement co-management agreements.
 - Develop and implement protocols outlining the practical steps per deliverable.
- e) Convene an inaugural co-management structure with relevant and identified stakeholders.
- f) Facilitate the development of founding documents such as, but not limited to, comanagement agreements, code of conduct, Terms of reference, etc.
- g) Develop and submit a schedule of facilitation workshops with representatives small-scale fishing co-operatives and identified stakeholders in Cape Metro, City of Cape Municipality, Western Cape for the identified local co-management structure. This should include:
 - Initial introduction workshop
 - Workshop on the development of TOR and nomination of a committee
 - Facilitation of problem and objective analysis
 - Identification of support and training needs, and
 - Development of action program

3.1.4 Training and capacity building

Conduct training and Capacity building (A minimum of 3 relevant and identified training themes-may be done in one seating)

- a) Identify training needs for the local co-management structure established/being established.
- b) Facilitate training sessions with identified stakeholders by:
 - i. Securing meeting venues
 - ii. Sending invites
 - iii. Transportation (where required) and accommodation (where necessary) of co-management members.
 - iv. Print training manual to the participants (Approximately 10 pages for all trainings) and trainings (may be non-accredited)
 - v. Provide stationery (notepads and pens)

- vi. Providing Logistics (as per heading 3.1.3 above)
- c) Capture attendance registers, minutes, videos clips of proceedings of all meetings.
- d) The following training themes may be used for the training session in one seating
 - i. Understanding Co-management
 - ii. Building effective Partnerships
 - iii. Conflict Resolution (Mediation and resolution strategies)
- e) Assist the MLRF with identifying training needs of the cooperatives.

4. **EVALUATION METHOD**

4.1 PHASE 1: FUNCTIONALITY AND TECHNICAL CRITERIA

Only bid proposals that meets pre-qualification will be considered to be evaluated on functionality and technical criteria. The bidder must score a minimum average of 60% during Phase 1 (functionality / technical) of the evaluation to qualify for Phase 2 of the evaluation will be considered. Should a bidder score less than 60% on functionality criteria, the bidder will be disqualified. The following values / indicators will be applicable when evaluating functionality:

4.2 Preferential Points (80/20 system)

- 4.2.1 An evaluation of Price and Specific Goals Preference points on the suppliers, that successful qualified to this stage of evaluation.
- **4.2.2 Calculation of points for price** The Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA) prescribes that the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points (for tenders under R50m) or 90 points (for tenders above R50m) for price. Suppliers that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis. Where functionality is set as criteria, only bid proposals that

meets functionality requirements will be considered for evaluation on price and specific goals preference points.

4.2.3 The 80/20 as an appropriate preference point system will be used in the evaluation and adjudication of this quote. However, it must be extended that the lowest acceptable quote will be used to determine the applicable preference point system as per regulation (Section 3(2)(b) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations (PPR) 2022, which states: "If it is unclear which preference point system will be applicable, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable proposal will be used to determine the applicable preference point system". Therefore, either 80 or 90 points, depending on the rand value of the proposal, will be awarded to the suppliers who offers the lowest price, and proportionately fewer points are awarded to those with higher prices. Either 20 or 10 points are then available as preference points for Specific Goals, as applicable. The contract will be awarded to the suppliers that scores the highest total number of adjudication points per category.

Calculating of points for Specific Goals

- 4.2.4 Points will be awarded to a supplier for specific goals. Bidders are required to submit the original and valid proof for preference points claimed or certified copies thereof; to substantiate their preference points claims. SBD 6.1 must also be duly completed, signed, and submitted alongside the bid to claim preference points. Failure to do so will result in Specific Goals preference points being forfeited.
- 4.2.5 The 80/20 as an appropriate preference point system will be used in the evaluation and adjudication of this quotation. However, it must be extended that the lowest acceptable supplier will be used to determine the applicable preference point system as per regulation (Section 3(2)(b) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations (PPR) 2022, which states: "If it is unclear which preference point system will be applicable, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable supplier will be used to determine the applicable preference point system". Therefore, either 80 or 90 points, depending on the rand value of the quotation, will be awarded to the suppliers who offers the lowest price, and proportionately fewer points are awarded to those with higher prices. Either 20 or 10 points are then available as preference points for specific goals, as applicable. The contract will be awarded to the suppliers that scores the highest total number of adjudication points per category.
- 4.2.6 Points will be awarded to a supplier for specific goals in accordance with the table below:

- 4.2.7 The SCM unit of the DFFE / MLRF will allocate preferential points (Specific Goals) to each company for its contribution towards empowerment of the black designated groups as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Regulations of 2022, women, people with disabilities, youth as well as local economic development.
- 4.2.8 A supplier will not be disqualified from the quotation process if the suppliers does not submit supporting documents substantiating the specific goals preference points claimed or is a non-compliant contributor. Such some suppliers will score 0 for Specific Goals.
- 4.2.9 Suppliers will be subject to SCM conditions of the Department MLRF and the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022 issued in terms of section 5 of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (Act No 5 of 2000) (PPPFA).
- 4.2.10 The PPPFA prescribes that the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 or 90 points for price (as explained above, depending on whether the bid prices is more or less than R50million). Suppliers that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis. Where functionality is set as a criterion, only bid proposals that meets functionality requirements will be considered to be evaluated on price and Specific Goals.
- 4.2.11 The contract will be awarded to the supplier scoring the highest points subject to section 2(1) (f) of the PPPFA, 2000.

5. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 5.1 Suppliers should ensure that the following submission requirements, which will be needed for evaluation purposes are included in their bid proposal and are as follows:
 - 5.1.1 The SP must draft a table of content which will indicate where each document is located `in the proposal.
 - 5.1.2 The proposal shall consist of two parts, namely the technical bid and the pricing bid (master and copies).
 - 5.1.3 Add documents that are required to be submitted with the bids. These documents include those included in phase one (1) and two (2) of evaluation criteria.
 - 5.1.4 Standard bidding documents (SBD1, 2, 3.1/3.3, 4, 6.1) completed and signed.
 - A valid copy of the Tax Clearance Certificate/ Tax Compliance Status Pin issued by SARS to the supplier/copy of Central Supplier Database (CSD)/ MA supplier Number must be submitted together with the bid.

- In case of bids where Consortia / Joint Ventures / Sub-contractors are involved; such
 must be clearly indicated, and each party must submit a separate copy of a valid Tax
 Clearance Certificate or copy of Tax Compliance Status Pin or CSD/ MAAA supplier
 Number together with the bid.
- Certified copies of identity documents of directors and shareholders of the company.
- Entity registration Certificate (CK1).
- Letter of Authority to sign documents on behalf of the company.

6 SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

- On appointment, the performance measures for the delivery of the agreed services will be closely monitored by Department / MLRF.
- The Department / MLRF will not be held responsible for any costs incurred by the SPs in the preparation, presentation and submission of the proposal.
- 6.3 All the conditions specified in the General Conditions of Contract (GCC) will apply and where the conditions in the special conditions of contract contradicts the conditions in the general conditions of contract, the special conditions of contract will prevail.

7 PAYMENT TERMS

- 7.1 The DFFE / MLRF undertakes to pay out in full or as per deliverables within 30 (thirty) days all valid claims for work done to its satisfaction upon presentation of a substantiated claim and the required reports stipulated in special conditions. No payment will be made where there is outstanding information/work not submitted by the Service Provider/s until that outstanding information is submitted.
- 7.2 Payment by the DFFE / MLRF shall be made by means of an electronic transfer into the SP's bank account.
- 7.3 Payment requirements
 - The successful Service Provider shall render services to the DFFE / MLRF in accordance with the Project Plan and Project Scope.
 - The amounts are inclusive of VAT and all disbursements shall be paid in South African Rands.

8. VIRTUAL COMPULSORY BRIEFING SESSION
