## TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF REQUEST FOR QUOTATION (RFQ)

## 1. Terms and conditions of Request for Quotation (RFQ)

- 1.1 This document may contain confidential information that is the property of the Marine Living Resources Fund [MLRF].
- 1.2 No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed, or conveyed in whole or in part to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a proposal in response to this RFQ without prior written permission from MLRF.
- 1.3 All copyright and intellectual property herein vests with MLRF.
- 1.4 Late and incomplete submissions will not be considered. Submissions received after closing time and date will be classified as LATE and WILL NOT be considered.
- 1.5 No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official MLRF Purchase Order form has been issued by a duly authorised official from the MLRF and received by the bidder. Please note that this is not an instruction to proceed with supply of any goods or service unless the quotation is approved, and a Purchase Order is supplied to you.
- 1.6 Please note that if you receive the Purchase Order, delivery of goods or rendering of services must be done within 14 calendar days or upon agreed time frames. Failing to deliver upon agreed times will result in your Purchase Order being cancelled.
- 1.7 This RFQ will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system if is equal to or below R50 million.
- 1.8 Bidders are required to register on the Central Supplier Database at <a href="www.csd.gov.za">www.csd.gov.za</a> if you are not registered on the CSD.
- 1.9 All questions regarding this RFQ must be forwarded to <a href="mailto:TNcobo@dffe.gov.za">TNcobo@dffe.gov.za</a> within 24 hours after the RFQ has been issued.
- 1.10 Any bidder who has reasons to believe that the RFQ specification is based on a specific brand must inform MLRF within two (2) days before the RFQ closing date.
- 1.11 Where quotations/proposals submitted are equal to or below R50 million, bidders are required to submit the original and valid proof for preference points claimed or certified copies thereof; to substantiate their preference points claims. SBD 6.1 must also be duly completed, signed, and submitted alongside the bid to claim preference points. Failure to do so will result in preference points being forfeited.
- 1.12 As per section 4(1) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations of 2022, the maximum 20 points may be awarded based on specific goals. The 20 points will be allocated as follows:

- 1.13 Bidders are required to duly complete, sign and submit the new SBD 4 together with their quotations/proposals. Failure to do so may result in your quotation/proposal <u>not</u> being accepted.
- 1.14 For designated sectors for local production and content, SBD 6.2 and Annexures C, D & E must be duly completed, signed and SBD 6.2 together with Annex E must be submitted with vour quotation/proposal.
- 1.15 All quotations/proposals submitted must be inclusive of Value Added Tax (VAT) if you are VAT registered and must be quoted in South African Rands (ZAR) and price must be firm.
- 1.16 The full costs must be disclosed as there will be no variances that will be entertained, and no price adjustment will be entertained after the Purchase Order has been issued.
- 1.17 These terms and conditions supersede any terms and conditions that may be issued by the service provider/supplier on their quotations or any other document similar to that.

- 1.18 Full and updated CSD report must be submitted with the quotation and MLRF will only contract with supplier's/service providers that their tax matters are in order.
- 1.19 The MLRF pays within 30 (thirty) days after receipt of a valid tax invoice and after approval of relevant invoice and reports and does not make upfront payments or deposits.
- 1.20 It is the responsibility of prospective bidders to ensure that all bid documents are submitted before the closing date and time of the RFQ.


## 2. PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

## **TERMS OF REFERENCE**

TO APPOINT A SERVICE PROVIDER (SP) TO PROVIDE THE DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY, FISHERIES AND THE ENVIRONMENT (DFFE) / MARINE LIVING RESOURCES FUND (MLRF) FOR SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF SERVICE PROVIDER/S (SP) TO CONDUCT FISHERY INDEPENDENT ABALONE SURVEYS (FIAS)

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#### PURPOSE

The Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment ("DFFE") / MLRF requires the services of a Service Provider/s (SP) to conduct Fishery-Independent Abalone Survey (FIAS)

## 2. SPECIFICATIONS

- To appoint a Service Provider/s (SP) to conduct yearly Fishery-Independent Abalone Survey (FIAS) of the commercial abalone (*Haliotis midae*) resource in three (3) zones, which are
  - 1. A (Quoin Point),
  - 2. B (Danger Point), and/or
  - 3. F (Robben Island)

in the Western Cape for a period of 18 months.

 Refer to attached Appendix A for a detailed description of the services, Appendix B for the protocol to be followed when conducting the surveys and, Appendix C for the maps for the zones.

## 3. EVALUATION METHOD

## 3.1. PHASE 1: MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

- 3.3.1. The following table must be completed by the bidder by answering YES OR NO and attach proof.
- 3.3.2. Only bidders who achieve a "Yes" and attach required proof for all mandatory requirements will proceed for evaluation to Phase 2.

Note pricing should be equivalent to a Class registration for all divers. Full compliance with labour requirements e.g. medicals up to date etc.		

## 3.2. Preferential Points (80/20 system)

- 3.2.1. An evaluation of Price and Specific Goals Preference points on the suppliers, that successful qualified to this stage of evaluation.
- 3.2.2. Calculation of points for price The Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA) prescribes that the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points (for tenders under R50m) or 90 points (for tenders above R50m) for price. Suppliers that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis. Where functionality is set as criteria, only bid proposals that meets functionality requirements will be considered for evaluation on price and specific goals preference points.
- 3.2.3. The 80/20 as an appropriate preference point system will be used in the evaluation and adjudication of this quote. However, it must be extended that the lowest acceptable quote will be used to determine the applicable preference point system as per regulation (Section 3(2)(b) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations (PPR) 2022, which states: "If it is unclear which preference point system will be applicable, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable proposal will be used to determine the applicable preference point system". Therefore, either 80 or 90 points, depending on the rand value of the proposal, will be awarded to the suppliers who offers the lowest price, and proportionately fewer points are awarded to those with higher prices. Either 20 or 10 points are then available as preference points for Specific Goals, as applicable. The contract will be awarded to the suppliers that scores the highest total number of adjudication points per category.

## Calculating of points for Specific Goals

- 3.2.4. Points will be awarded to a supplier for specific goals. Bidders are required to submit the original and valid proof for preference points claimed or certified copies thereof; to substantiate their preference points claims. SBD 6.1 must also be duly completed, signed, and submitted alongside the bid to claim preference points. Failure to do so will result in Specific Goals preference points being forfeited.
- 3.2.5. The 80/20 as an appropriate preference point system will be used in the evaluation and adjudication of this quotation. However, it must be extended that the lowest acceptable supplier will be used to determine the applicable preference point system as per regulation (Section 3(2)(b) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations (PPR) 2022, which states: "If it is unclear which preference point system will be applicable, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable supplier will be used to determine the applicable preference point system". Therefore, either 80 or 90 points, depending on the rand value of the quotation, will be awarded to the suppliers who offers the lowest price, and proportionately fewer points are awarded to those with higher prices. Either 20 or 10 points are then available as preference points for specific goals, as applicable. The contract will be awarded to the suppliers that scores the highest total number of adjudication points per category.
- 3.2.6. Points will be awarded to a supplier for specific goals in accordance with the table below:

- 3.2.7. The SCM unit of the DFFE / MLRF will allocate preferential points (Specific Goals) to each company for its contribution towards empowerment of the black designated groups as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Regulations of 2022, women, people with disabilities, youth as well as local economic development.
- 3.2.8. A supplier will not be disqualified from the quotation process if the suppliers does not submit supporting documents substantiating the specific goals preference points claimed or is a noncompliant contributor. Such some suppliers will score 0 for Specific Goals.
- 3.2.9. Suppliers will be subject to SCM conditions of the Department MLRF and the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022 issued in terms of section 5 of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (Act No 5 of 2000) (PPPFA).
- 3.2.10. The PPPFA prescribes that the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 or 90 points for price (as explained above, depending on whether the bid prices is more or less than R50million). Suppliers that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis. Where functionality is set as a criterion, only bid proposals that meets functionality requirements will be considered to be evaluated on price and Specific Goals.
- 3.2.11. The contract will be awarded to the supplier scoring the highest points subject to section 2(1) (f) of the PPPFA, 2000.

## 4. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 4.1 Suppliers should ensure that the following submission requirements, which will be needed for evaluation purposes are included in their bid proposal and are as follows:
- 4.1.1 The SP must draft a table of content which will indicate where each document is located in the proposal.
- 4.1.2 The proposal shall consist of two parts, namely the technical bid and the pricing bid (master and copies).
- 4.1.3 Add documents that are required to be submitted with the bids. These documents include those included in phase one (1) and two (2) of evaluation criteria.
- 4.1.4 Standard bidding documents (SBD1, 2, 3.1/3.3, 4, 6.1) completed and signed.
  - A valid copy of the Tax Clearance Certificate/ Tax Compliance Status Pin issued by SARS to the supplier/copy of Central Supplier Database (CSD)/ MA supplier Number must be submitted together with the bid.
  - In case of bids where Consortia / Joint Ventures / Sub-contractors are involved; such
    must be clearly indicated, and each party must submit a separate copy of a valid Tax
    Clearance Certificate or copy of Tax Compliance Status Pin or CSD/ MAAA supplier
    Number together with the bid.
  - Certified copies of identity documents of directors and shareholders of the company.
  - Entity registration Certificate (CK1).
  - Letter of Authority to sign documents on behalf of the company.

## 5. SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

- 5.1 On appointment, the performance measures for the delivery of the agreed services will be closely monitored by Department / MLRF.
- 5.2 The Department / MLRF will not be held responsible for any costs incurred by the SPs in the preparation, presentation and submission of the proposal.

5.3 All the conditions specified in the General Conditions of Contract (GCC) will apply and where the conditions in the special conditions of contract contradicts the conditions in the general conditions of contract, the special conditions of contract will prevail.

## 6. PAYMENT TERMS

- 6.1 The DFFE / MLRF undertakes to pay out in full or as per deliverables within 30 (thirty) days all valid claims for work done to its satisfaction upon presentation of a substantiated claim and the required reports stipulated in special conditions. No payment will be made where there is outstanding information/work not submitted by the Service Provider/s until that outstanding information is submitted.
- 6.2 Payment by the DFFE / MLRF shall be made by means of an electronic transfer into the SP's bank account.
- 6.3 Payment requirements
  - The successful Service Provider shall render services to the DFFE / MLRF in accordance with the Project Plan and Project Scope.

Appendix A. Request to appointment a service provider (SP) to conduct Fishery Independent Abalone Surveys (FIAS) of the commercial abalone (*Haliotis midae*) resource in Zones A (Quoin Point), B (Danger Point), and F (Robben Island) in the Western Cape for a period of 18 months

## Detailed description of goods and services:

Line no.	Description
1.	The Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (DFFE) seeks to appoint a suitable service provider (SP) to conduct Fishery Independent Abalone Surveys (FIAS) of the commercial abalone (Haliotis midae) resource for a period of 18 months, between November 2023 and March 2024 and November 2024 and March 2025 in the following zones:  - Zone A (Quoin Point)  - Zone B (Danger Point)  - Zone F (Robben Island)
2.	The method will include SCUBA diving, with associated dive gear. The scope of the work entails the <i>in situ</i> counting and measuring of abalone of each listed zone annually. The sampling will be non-destructive, and no abalone will be removed from the sea during the process. The survey includes counting and measuring of up to twenty stations (30 m x 2m transects) at shallow sites (2-5 m depth) and up to twelve stations (50 m x 2m transects) at deeper sites (from 6 m depth) in each of the zones. The FIAS protocol (Appendix B) and map of the fishery Zones (Appendix C) are attached for reference. The transects must be followed at fixed locations with GPS coordinates supplied by DFFE abalone section.
3.	The SP must provide the data of the survey in the format required by DFFE after each annual survey has been completed. Electronic copy of the datasheet will be provided by DFFE.
4.	The SP must indicate which zone(s) they are quoting for. One quote per zone must be provided (i.e. must <u>not</u> provide a total quote for more than one zone). Compliance with the Department of Labour regulations is essential. Supporting documents such as relevant copies of valid qualifications of the team (i.e. dive supervisor(s), skipper(s), and at least four divers and one stand-by diver).
5.	The suitable SP must sign a confidentiality agreement with DFFE regarding the location of the dive sites.
6.	Mandatory virtual briefing session to be held whereby at least one representative of the potential SP will be present.

#### Appendix B. Fishery-Independent Abalone Survey (FIAS) Protocol

#### **Objective**

A direct assessment survey method which will yield an unbiased annual index of abalone abundance for each fishery management zone (A to G). Changes in this index with time will be used to assess the state of the resource, and provide an alternative research tool to the presently used fishery-dependent methods. Simultaneously collected length-frequency data will permit qualitative evaluation of the population structure.

#### The Index

Given the requirement for repeatability, even with a completely different diving team, transects are favoured since this method is likely to be less affected by variables such as diver experience & sea conditions. The transects will be perpendicular to the shore, at fixed positions, evenly spaced within each survey area (fishery TAC zone). The actual inter-transect spacing per zone was determined by the combination of coastline length and number of transects. Frequency of the surveys per zone to be annual.

#### Transect length and number

Data from previous diving surveys giving abalone counts per 10 m transect sector were analyzed to determine the effect of varying transect length and number of transects on the coefficient of variation (CV). It was decided that a 30 m transect would prove the most practically manageable length, while still providing the required CV. A reasonable logistical target was agreed to be a maximum of 20 transects per zone.

In addition, in order to cater for concerns over the lack of information on stocks in the deeper water, it seemed appropriate to include one deeper (+6m) transect of 50 m length swum per every 5 shallow transects to provide some data on this stratum. This was done by starting at transect number two (for any zone) and doing "deep" transects every 5th station (# 2, 7, 12, 17). The need has arisen to increase the sampling of the deeper water due to data limitations (no CPUE data) brought about by the closure of the commercial fishery. Therefore from 2009, in addition to the "deep" stations that are routinely sampled, all other even numbered stations will be included. The "deep" transects will therefore include station numbers: 2, 4, 6, 7, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16, 17, 18 & 20.

#### Depth range


Given that 77% of the surface-visible kelp lies within the 0-5m depth range, and that this is also where the highest abalone densities were encountered historically, the survey strategy is concentrated within this range. Because the very shallow (<2 m) sector poses significant logistical problems due to swell effects, the depth range 3-4 m will be targeted. This will be assumed to be representative of the abalone population as a whole. In addition, transects will also be carried out in deeper water (+6m) as indicated above.

#### **Transect Positioning**

In the absence of any indication that abalone abundance was likely to be correlated in any way with coastal features, other than the occurrence of kelp beds, a regular spacing strategy was adopted for placement of the transects. Using a cartographic digitising program and known latitude and longitude reference points the lat/long positions of each survey station were determined. These are then located in the field using a Global Positioning System (GPS). Once as close as possible to the GPS position, the boat is moved inshore or offshore until anchored at a start depth of 2 m below Mean Low Water Spring (SAN Tide Tables) which is determined using the echo sounder.

#### **Transects**

Two divers attach the 30 m/50 m (depending on depth) line to the anchor, or a kelp stipe, and swim offshore perpendicular to the coastline (on a compass bearing). They swim on either side of the line, counting and measuring abalone within a 1 m swathe on either side of the line. The width of 1 m is checked occasionally using the custom-designed sliding weight with a line of 1 m attached. The abalone are measured as encountered, and shell lengths (mm) are recorded within each 10 m sector. In high densities, in order to reduce measuring time, a maximum total of 40 abalone are measured, (the first 20 in the 1st 10 m sector, and the next 20 of the last 10 m sector are measured, per diver). The remaining abalone larger than 100 mm shell length are just counted.
